

The MWF Habitat Foundation Inc. Newest Acquisition -- The Taylor Property

In September of 2008 Westlake Wildlife Association President Fred Taylor called the office with information that Cliff and Eva Taylor (no relation to Fred) of Ste Rose du Lac wanted to donate a parcel of land to the MWF Habitat Foundation Inc. Later that same month, Chairman of the MWF Habitat Foundation, Lawrie Hilton and I met with the Taylors in St. Rose du Lac to discuss what their expectations were for the property. We explained what the Foundation could do in receiving the land they were wishing to donate.

Shortly after the meeting, proceedings were started. An agreement was written up and sent to the Taylors for their approval. The Taylors' lawyer went over the details of the agreement with them. Being satisfied with the agreement, the Taylors returned the signed copies and the Foundation's lawyer started the process of transferring the land to the MWF Habitat Foundation Inc.

The location of the property is west and then north of Eddystone which is between St. Rose du Lac and Lake Manitoba Narrows off Highway #68 (N/E 28-24-13WPM). The land is an old farm site of about 15 acres in size with some old buildings. The area is grown over with trees and shrubs with a small pasture area. On our visit we sighted a couple of whitetails.

Signage has been made up acknowledging the land donors, Cliff and Eva Taylor, and Westlake Wildlife Association as supporters of the property. Westlake Game and Fish Association will be looking after the property, along with providing annual funding to cover the property taxes.
